Numeracy	<p>Happy International Puzzle Day! Complete the Math Puzzle Activity worksheet. Fill in the missing numbers and create a math puzzle of your own. For an extra challenge, create a similar puzzle using multiplication and division.</p> <p><b>Prodigy: 30 minutes</b> ●</p>	<p>Number of the day! Choose a number of your choice and complete the activity sheet to show off your math knowledge! Challenges for extended learning: select a larger number and/or multiply and divide instead of adding and subtracting.</p> <p><b>Prodigy: 30 minutes</b> ●</p>	<p>Think about the meaning of the word <i>symmetrical</i>. What are some items around your home that are symmetrical. For each of the four images, come up with one reason why each one is different from the others. What do you notice? How many Epics are there altogether? How many more Florafox Epics are there than Magmischief Epics?</p> <p><b>Prodigy: 30 minutes</b> ●</p>
Literacy	<p>Alliterations are when words start with the same letter or sound – for example, Educational Ed, or Practice Playing Prodigy! On the 'Alliteration' page, can you think of a phrase that uses alliteration for every letter of the alphabet?</p> <p><b>Read: 20 minutes</b> ●</p>	<p>Personification is when you give something (that's not human) human characteristics (i.e. car or tree). Using the examples provided, can you find the word that personifies each sentence?</p> <p><b>Read: 20 minutes</b> ●</p>	<p>What are some funny jokes you know? Write them down on strips of paper and pick one every morning to share with a friend or family member. Can you create your own? Think of knock-knock jokes, math jokes, puns or riddles!</p> <p><b>Read: 20 minutes</b> ●</p>	<p>Read the short section from the nonsense poem <i>Jabberwocky</i>. A nonsense poem is a poem that is whimsical, funny, and nonsensical!</p> <p>Read this poem out loud to a family member and try to pronounce all the funny words!</p> <p><b>Read: 20 minutes</b> ●</p>	<p>How many words can you make using only the letters A, C, E, G, I, J, L, and O? (Each word can use any number of these letters, but only one time each)</p> <p>Can you write a story using only those words?</p> <p><b>Read: 20 minutes</b></p>
Physical	<p>Make an indoor obstacle course and complete it. Challenge someone at home to complete it with you.</p>	<p>Have a 'slow race' with a family member. You both move across the room as slowly as you can (but you have to be moving, not stopped). The last person to reach the other side of the room wins!</p>	<p>Hop hop hop! Make your own hopscotch with chalk on the pavement or tape indoors. You could even use the floor tiles in your home as markers! The bigger your boxes are, the harder it is to hop! Challenge a family member to try your hopscotch!</p>	<p>Lemon race! Mark a start point and a finish point. Hold a spoon in your mouth. Ask your parents for a lemon. The lemon needs to be balanced on the spoon. The one to reach the finish line first, wins! Did you know this can increase your concentration and patience level?</p>	<p>Let's go surfing! Lie on your belly and use your arms to swim really fast. Count to 8, then jump up and pretend you're surfing on your board with your knees bent. Surf for 8 seconds, then get back on your belly and swim while counting to 8! Do this 10 times!</p>
Social & Emotional	<p>In the spirit of International Puzzle Day, color in the picture of Ed, then cut out the pieces and put the puzzle together again. Once you are done, create your own puzzle and challenge someone at home to complete it.</p>	<p>Using the personification sentences from today's literacy activity, choose one of the sentences and draw a picture of what it might look like. Challenge: Try to draw one picture with as many personified sentences as possible. How many can you put into one drawing?</p>	<p>Create a personal calming jar using an empty water bottle and small items such as rice, beans, or pom poms. Place the small objects into your bottle first then add enough water to fill the bottle. Make sure your cap is on tight. Shake the bottle and watch the objects settle to help find calm.</p>	<p>Re-read the poem <i>Jabberwocky</i>. Can you draw a picture of the Jabberwock, the Jubjub bird, or the Bandersnatch? What would they look like?</p>	<p>Mood Tracker! How did the week go? Write down the different emotions you felt. What color did most of your emotions belong to?</p>

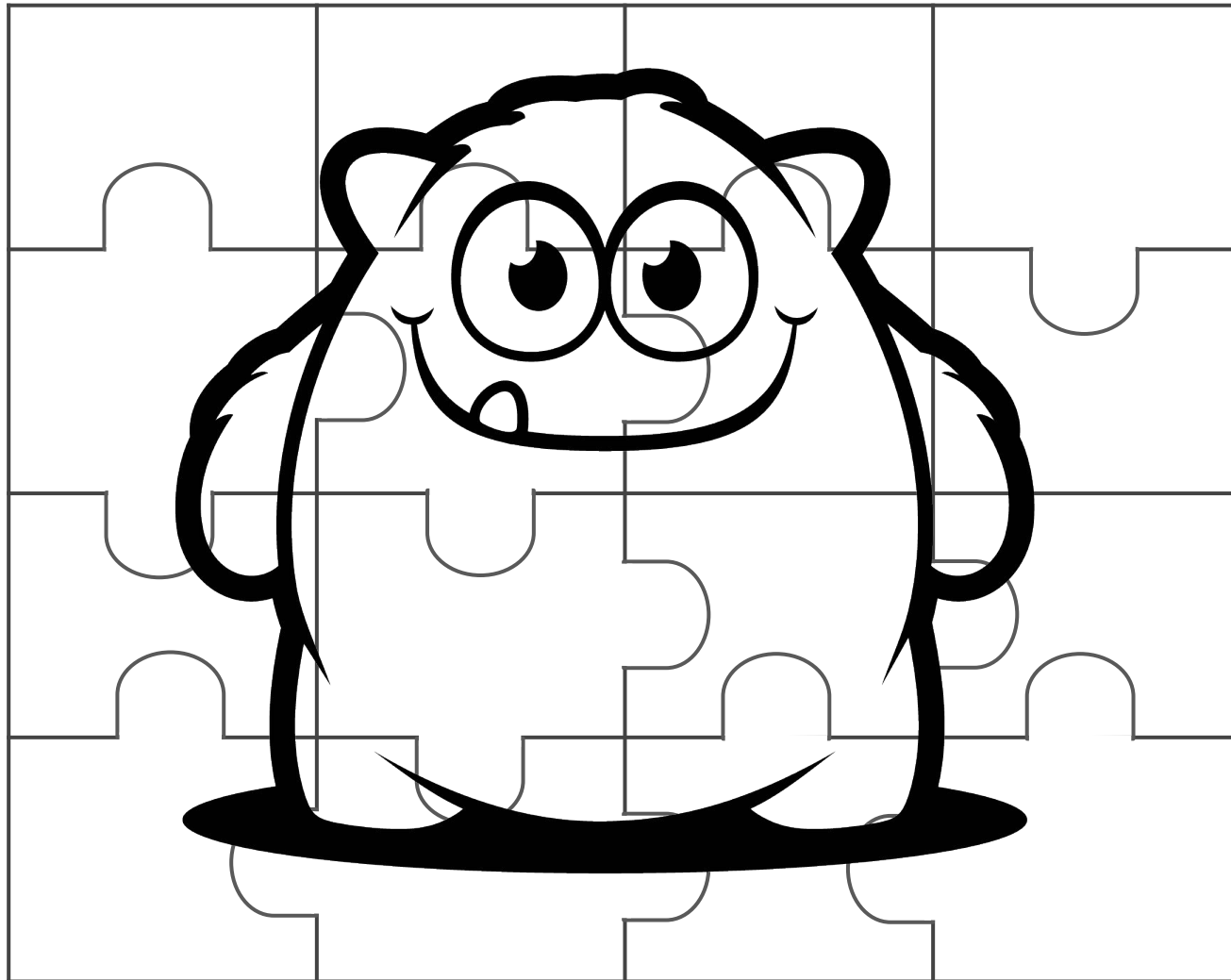

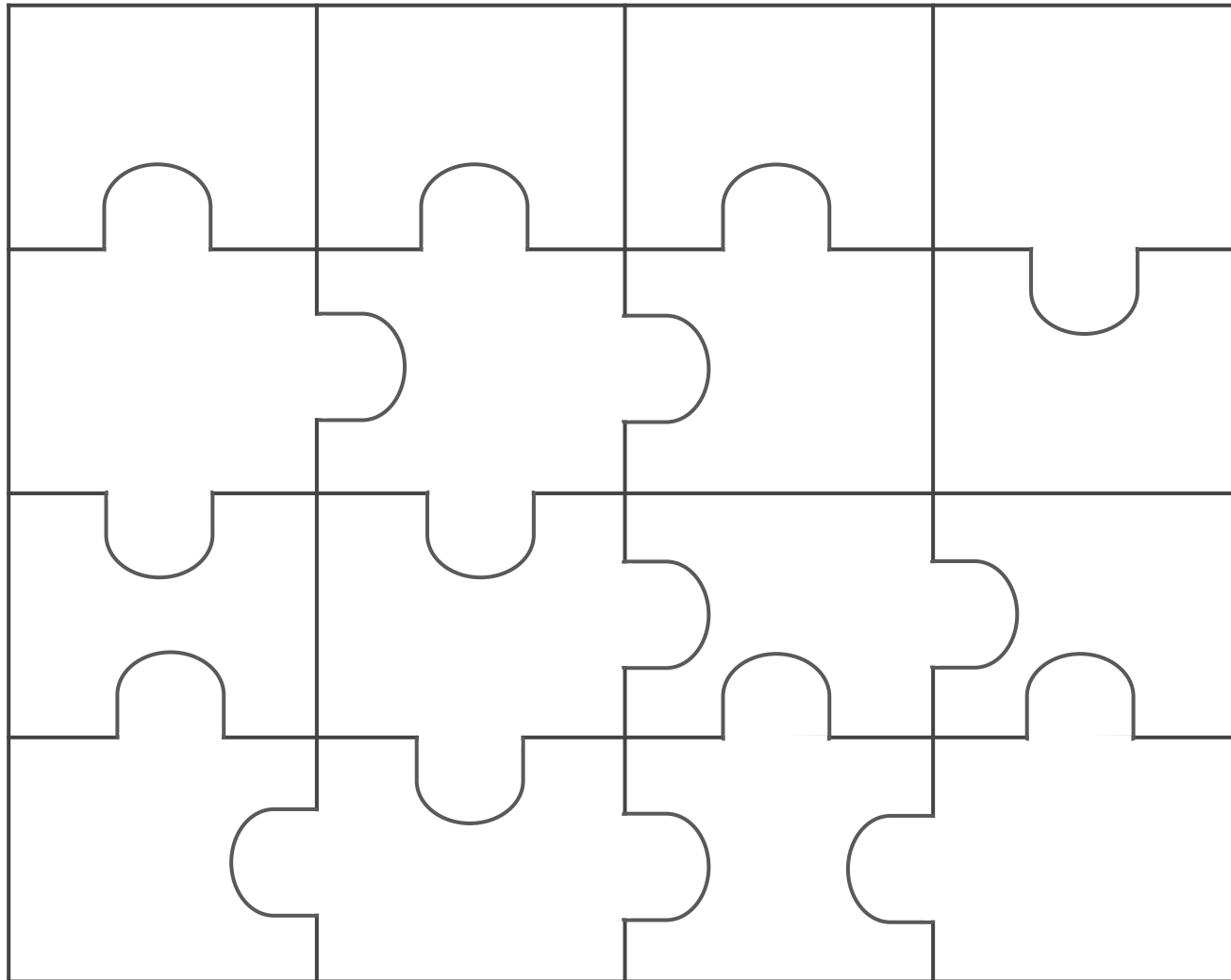
Color in the puzzle template (be as creative as you'd like!).

- Lightning pranced across the dark sky.

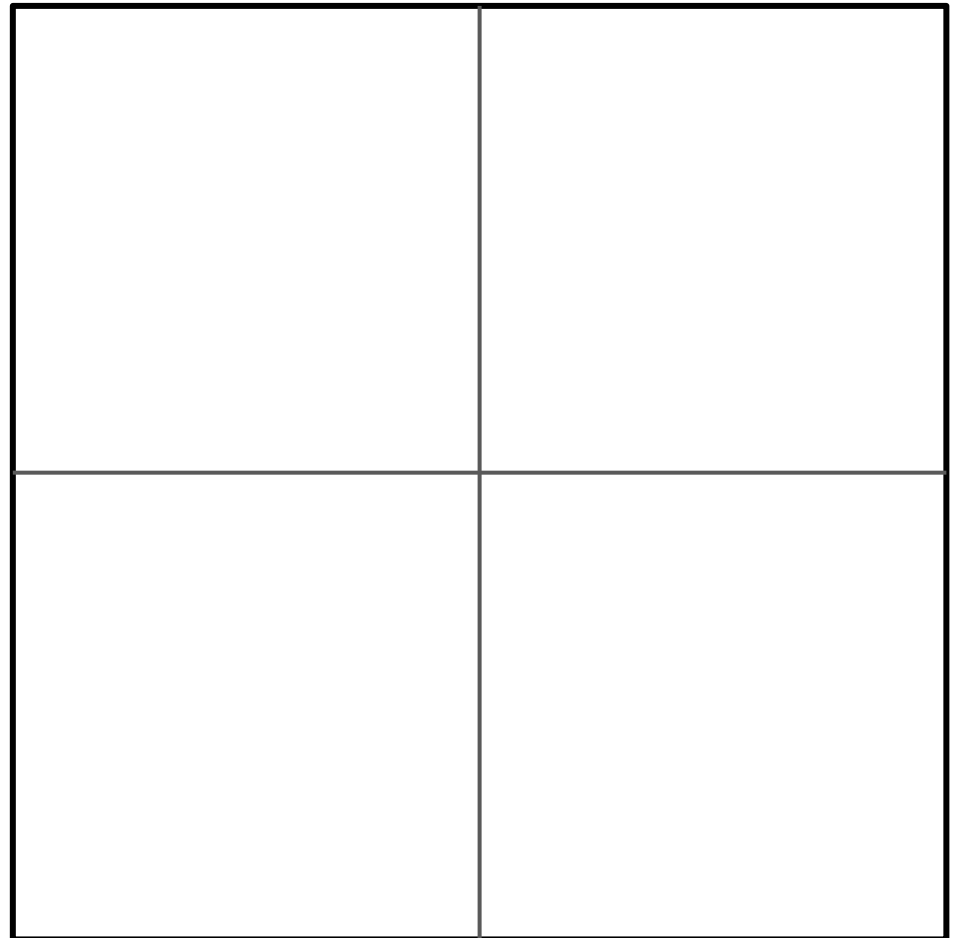
